Target Tokyo

We have a number of athletes currently going through selection process for British Shooting/UK Sport led “Target Tokyo”.

This will be in three Phases

1. **Phase one** was a one day selection process with just basic skills being sought by experienced coaches,
2. **Phase two** a two day process with more technical involvement
3. **Phase three** is more detailed involvement with an estimated small number still in contention for further involvement with the British Shooting World Class system.

- Shotgun are already on “Phase two” and there are a number (5) of Welsh Shotgun athletes involved after selection from Phase one
- Welsh athletes were participating in Rifle & Pistol at Bisley 24/25th January “Phase two” involved with 6 Rifle and 4 Pistol Welsh athletes competing in Phase two. Each of these athletes will/have been asked to train with Wales training squads. (It’s expected that Phase three of the Rifle and Pistol will take place at the High Performance ranges in Cardiff over the Easter weekend)

It was strongly stated that agreed standards for Gold Coast 2018 that are lower than Glasgow 2014 are not going to be accepted by Sport Wales and the CGW Board All 2018 sports standards and policies have to be sanctioned with the CGW board and published on relevant Sports websites prior to the end of **November 2016**. Where sports cannot agree to stricter standards CGW reserve the right to set standards.
